

These house rules apply on the Miami Nice festival site at E.S.R. Thêta, Kanaaldijk-Zuid 50, Eindhoven. By entering the site you agree to these house rules. You can read them in advance at miaminice.nl. If the Dutch and English versions differ, the Dutch version applies.

ENTRY

- Miami Nice is only open to students aged 18 and over. Bring a valid ID and your student card, because we ask for them at the entrance. We only look at these documents and do not copy them.
- The doors close at 18:00. After that you can no longer enter the site. Arriving later for a good reason? Email info@miaminice.nl beforehand and we can make an exception.
- At the entrance, security checks for weapons, drugs and other prohibited items. If you do not cooperate with this check, you will not be let in.

YOU CAN BE REFUSED ENTRY IF YOU

- are visibly drunk or under the influence of drugs;
- cannot show a valid ticket, ID or student card;
- do not cooperate with the check at the entrance;
- have previously been banned from Miami Nice.

GENERAL

- Always follow the instructions of staff, security, first aid and water supervisors.
- Food and drinks on site can only be paid for with coins on your wristband. Any coins you have left are refunded after the festival.
- Hand in found items at the bar. After the festival we post found items on Instagram.
- Have a complaint? Tell a member of the organisation or email info@miaminice.nl.
- Feeling unsafe, or seeing someone cross a line? Report it straight away to a staff member or security.

MEDICATION AND HEALTH

- You may bring your own medication in its original packaging, with a medication passport from your pharmacy or a doctor's note. Show it during the check at the entrance.
- If you need your own food for medical reasons, for example diabetes, you may bring it. Mention it at the entrance.
- Feeling unwell or need help? Go to the first aid post or talk to a staff member.

SWIMMING

- Swimming is only allowed in the marked swimming area.
- Always follow the instructions of the water supervisors. They can ask you to leave the water, for example when it is not safe.
- You swim at your own responsibility. Alcohol increases the risk, so know your limits.

IT IS PROHIBITED TO

- possess, use or deal drugs, including nitrous oxide (laughing gas);
- carry weapons or objects that can be used as a weapon;
- steal, damage property, or sell or handle stolen goods;
- use or threaten violence;
- discriminate against or insult anyone;
- sexually harass anyone, by words, gestures or touch;
- bring professional cameras, such as video cameras and cameras with interchangeable lenses;
- take photos or videos for commercial purposes without permission from the organisation.

IT IS NOT ALLOWED TO

- bring your own food or drinks, except food you need for medical reasons;
- take food or drinks off the site;
- throw objects or drinks, including at artists or the mixing desks;
- bring animals, except assistance dogs;
- smoke indoors;
- cause noise nuisance or leave litter in the area around the site, including when you leave.

PHOTOS AND VIDEOS

- Our photographers and videographers capture Miami Nice for our website, social media, the aftermovie and presentations for partners. You may be recognisable in these images.
- Don't want to be recognisable? Tell the photographer. If you are in a photo you would rather not see online, email info@miaminice.nl and we will take it down. Read more in our privacy statement at miaminice.nl/en/privacy.

LIABILITY

- You are responsible for your own belongings. As far as the law allows, Stichting Miami Nice and its staff and volunteers are not liable for loss, theft or damage of your belongings.
- If you cause damage, we will recover the costs from you.

IF YOU BREAK THE HOUSE RULES

- we can remove you from the site and ban you from future editions. If you are banned, we note your name. Read more about this in our privacy statement;
- we call the police if you refuse to leave the site (trespassing);
- if you are caught committing a criminal offence, you can be detained and handed over to the police straight away. We take prohibited items from you and hand them to the police, and we report the offence.

In situations these house rules do not cover, the organisation decides. Dutch law and the local by-laws (APV) of the municipality of Eindhoven apply on the site.
